

EECC: DAB+ in cars

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15 million new cars sold in Europe in 2018

One third with DAB+



H1 2020: over 50% with DAB+



Leading countries over 90%





Source: WorldDAB, JATO, industry sources; countries above accounted for 74% of new car sales in Europe in 2019 – in these markets collectively DAB was in 70% of all new cars

European Electronic Communications Code (EECC)



- From 21 December 2020, all new car radios sold in EU must be able to receive digital terrestrial radio
- Applies to all EU Member States
 - established DAB+ markets
 - those yet to launch national services



First countries have passed national laws
