Willoughby City Council has announced its decision to approve the installation of a digital radio antenna on Willoughby Tower, allowing trial digital radio services to commence by the end of the year.

"This is exciting news as this is the trigger for digital radio broadcasts on VHF Band III to be heard Sydney-wide by the end of the year," said Joan Warner, CEO of Commercial Radio Australia. "The trial will be closely watched by other countries as it is the most comprehensive listener and advertiser driven test of this new technology undertaken anywhere in the world. It will allow Australian listeners to experience the benefits of digital radio for themselves and will be critical in assessing what the 'digital product' will be, and, which technology will work best for the Australian market."

Supermarket giants Tesco and Sainsbury's will stock DAB digital radios. Over the next few months, Tesco will trial sales of digital radios in 17 of its stores, while Sainsbury's will roll out in 125 outlets.

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New Products

The **Blaupunkt Woodstock DAB53** has now shipped: AM/FM/DAB in-car receiver with CD. Playback of audio CDs/CD ROMs, CD-RW compatible, MMC/ SD, MMC card reader, MP3/MP2 player. Priced around £449, but a package price of £499.99 includes an on-glass aerial and 64mb MMC card.

... and since the last WorldDAB newsletter, three new DAB products have been shipped in the UK. These include:

Goodmans GCE7007DAB In-Car Digital Radio: This is the first in-car DAB digital radio with unified aerial technology. In most cases, the radio operates using an existing car aerial. Along with full DAB functionality, the GCE7007DAB incorporates a CD player FM/MW/LW RDS analogue radio with Traffic Announcement System and 30 station pre-sets. Priced around £199.

PersTel BlueNote: Retailing at under £100, the latest product from PersTel is the most cost-effective hand-held DAB digital radio on the market. The BlueNote is a DAB only battery operated pocket radio. Priced at £99.99

Pure Digital's Evoke-2: Stereo digital radio and FM with mains or battery options. Features include two 3 inch speakers, scrolling LCD data display, socket for stereo analogue audio output and DAB optical output, headphone socket, six pre-sets, time and date display and a mains adaptor. Priced around £159.

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Technology

Acoustic Solutions will base its DAB products on the new RS200 DAB module from RadioScape. The RS200 is based on the DRE200, Texas Instruments' advanced baseband technology. Acoustic Solution's first product using this technology will be a DAB hi-fi tuner, the SP111. Although Acoustic Solutions is

currently focused on the UK for sales, the company is looking to expand sales into other countries.

The dDAB consortium has announced live consumer trials for multimedia radio in the UK. Consumers can listen to live audio channels while at the same time viewing synchronised visual content delivered via DAB Digital Radio data streams. The aim of the trials is to assess the quality, relevance and effectiveness of the visual data delivered in conjunction with the audio. The trials will take place in London and Loughborough and will use NTL Broadcast's experimental L-Band Multiplex and a research multiplex at Loughborough University.
